This workshop is the Third annual workshop organised by the IMAGENU Project, a four-year research collaboration bringing together researchers from Gulu University (Uganda), Aarhus University and Copenhagen University in Denmark. This project is supported by the Research Council for Development Research in Denmark and aims to build research capacity in Universities between the global North and South.

The main focus of IMAGENU lies on studying changes in marriage and partnership patterns and interpersonal gender relations in northern and eastern Uganda and how these are related to child filiation, education, livelihoods and health.

The theme of this year's workshop is GENDER and we meet to share findings, work on our common methodologies and plan collaboration for publications and conferences. Due to COVID-19 this year's workshop takes place on zoom from Denmark and is partly on site and online in Gulu.

We have three external international keynotes with us for this workshop: Prof. Julia Pauli, Prof. Lyn Ossome and Prof. Shanti Parihk.
